Privacy Policy for the Community of St Mary the Virgin at Wantage

We want everyone who supports us, or who comes to us for support, to feel confident and comfortable with how any personal information you share with us will be looked after or used. This Privacy Policy sets out how we collect, use and store your personal information (this means any information that identifies or could identify you).

The Privacy Policy may change so please remember to check back from time to time, this version was last updated on the 7 June 2018. Where we have made any changes to this Privacy Policy, we will make this clear on our website or contact you about any changes.

We are committed to treating you with respect and openness.

1. Who we are

Here at CSMV, we are committed to protecting your personal information and making every effort to ensure that your personal information is processed in a fair, open and transparent manner.

We are a "data controller" for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998 and (from 25 May 2018) the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 ("Data Protection Law"). This means that we are responsible for, and control the processing of, your personal information.

2. How we collect information about you

We want to make sure you receive the communications that are most relevant to you, be it through visiting our website or receiving emails, post or phone calls. We want to make sure you receive the best attention when you book onto an event or for a retreat, or make a donation.

We collect information from you in the following ways:

When you interact with us directly: this could be if you ask us about our activities, register with us for a retreat or an event, make a donation to us or otherwise provide us with your personal information. This includes when you phone us, visit our website or get in touch through the post, or in person.

When you visit our website: we gather general information that might include which pages you visit most often and which services, events or information is of most interest to you. We may

also track which pages you visit when you click on links in emails from us. We also use "cookies" to help our site run effectively. There are more details below – see 'Cookies'.

We use this information to personalise the way our website is presented when you visit to make improvements and to ensure we provide the best service and experience for you. Wherever possible we use anonymous information which does not identify individual visitors to our website.

3. Information we collect and why we use it

Personal Information

Personal information we collect includes details such as your name, date of birth, email address, postal address, telephone number and credit/debit card details (if you are making a purchase or donation), as well as information you provide in any communications between us. You will have given us this information whilst making a donation, registering for an event, or any of the other ways to interact with us.

We will mainly use this information:

- To process your donations or other payments, to claim Gift Aid on your donations and verify any financial transactions.
- To provide the services or goods that you have requested.
- To contact you about our work and how you can support us
- To update you with important administrative messages about your donation, an event or services or goods you have requested.
- To comply with the Charities (Protection and Social Investment) Act 2016 and follow the recommendations of the official regulator of charities, the Charity Commission, which require us to identify and verify the identity of supporters who make major gifts so we can assess any risks associated with accepting their donations.
- To keep a record of your relationship with us.
- Where you volunteer with us, to administer the volunteering arrangement.

If you do not provide this information, we will not be able to process your donation, sign you up for a particular event or provide goods and services you have requested.

We will only use this information:

- For the purposes of dealing with your enquiry, training, and quality monitoring or evaluating the services we provide.
- We will not pass on your details to anyone else without your express permission except in exceptional circumstances. Examples of this might include anyone reporting serious self-harm or posing a threat to others or children contacting us and sharing serious issues such as physical abuse or exploitation.

5. Legal basis for using your information

In some cases, we will only use your personal information because we need to use it in order to fulfil a contract with you (for example, because you have placed an order on our website or are coming to stay in our Guestwing).

However, there are other lawful reasons that allow us to process your personal information and one of those is called 'legitimate interests'. This means that the reason that we are processing information is because there is a legitimate interest for us to process your information to help us to achieve our vision:

- I. To advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public, in particular through maintaining St Mary's Convent, Wantage and sustaining the religious community there, as well as the promotion of the religious life generally, in accordance with the doctrine of the Church of England and of those churches in communion with the Church of England;
- II. For the benefit of the public, to promote and support education in institutions or through projects which have an Anglican character, or through joint and ecumenical enterprises which include an Anglican partner, in such ways as the trustees think fit;
- III. To support projects which assist in the care and treatment of persons suffering from illness of any description or in need of rehabilitation, in particular for vulnerable women and girls suffering from mental illnesses, including through the provision by such projects of facilities for work and recreation and in the promotion of health education

Whenever we process your Personal Information under the 'legitimate interest' lawful basis we make sure that we take into account your rights and interests and will not process your personal information if we feel that there is an imbalance.

Some examples of where we have a legitimate interest to process your Personal information are where we share with you by post our newsletter about our work overseas, or for complying with guidance from the Charity Commission.

6. Marketing

We will only contact you about our work and how you can support CSMV if you have agreed for us to contact you in this manner.

7. Sharing your Information

The personal information we collect about you will be used by our staff (and volunteers) at CSMV.

We will never sell or share your personal information with organisations so that they can contact you for any marketing activities. Nor do we sell any information about your web browsing activity.

Legal disclosure

We may disclose your information if required to do so by law (for example, to comply with applicable laws, regulations and codes of practice or in response to a valid request from a competent authority); or, in order to enforce our conditions of sale and other agreements.

8. Keeping your information safe

We take looking after your information very seriously. We've implemented appropriate physical, technical and organisational measures to protect the personal information we have under our control, both on and off-line, from improper access, use, alteration, destruction and loss.

Unfortunately the transmission of information using the internet is not completely secure. Although we do our best to protect your personal information sent to us this way, we cannot guarantee the security of data transmitted to our site.

Our websites may contain links to other sites. While we try to link only to sites that share our high standards and respect for privacy, we are not responsible for the content or the privacy practices employed by other sites. Please be aware that advertisers or Web sites that have links on our site may collect personally identifiable information about you. This privacy statement does not cover the information practices of those websites or advertisers.

9. How long we hold your information for

We only keep it as long as is reasonable and necessary for the relevant activity, which may be to fulfil statutory obligations (for example, the collection of Gift Aid).

10. Your rights

You have various rights in respect of the personal information we hold about you – these are set out in more detail below. If you wish to exercise any of these rights or make a complaint, you can do so by contacting St Mary's Convent, Denchworth Road, Wantage, OX12 9AU, by email Gina. Hocking@csmv.co.uk and by phone 01235 763141. You can also make a complaint to the data protection supervisory authority, the Information Commissioner's Office, https://ico.org.uk/:

- Access to your personal information: You have the right to request access to a copy of the
 personal information that we hold about you, along with information on what personal
 information we use, why we use it, who we share it with, how long we keep it for and
 whether it has been used for any automated decision making. You can make a request for
 access free of charge. Please make all requests for access in writing, and provide us with
 evidence of your identity.
- Right to object: You can object to our processing of your personal information where we are
 relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your
 particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also
 have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct
 marketing purposes. Please contact us as noted above, providing details of your objection.
- Consent: If you have given us your consent to use personal information (for example, for marketing), you can withdraw your consent at any time.
- Rectification: You can ask us to change or complete any inaccurate or incomplete personal information held about you.
- Erasure: You can ask us to delete your personal information where it is no longer necessary
 for us to use it, you have withdrawn consent, or where we have no lawful basis for keeping
 it.
- Portability: You can ask us to provide you or a third party with some of the personal
 information that we hold about you in a structured, commonly used, electronic form, so it
 can be easily transferred.
- Restriction: You can ask us to restrict the personal information we use about you where you have asked for it to be erased or where you have objected to our use of it.

No automated-decision making: Automated decision-making takes place when an electronic
system uses personal information to make a decision without human intervention. You have
the right not to be subject to automated decisions that will create legal effects or have a
similar significant impact on you, unless you have given us your consent, it is necessary for a
contract between you and us or is otherwise permitted by law. You also have certain rights
to challenge decisions made about you. We do not currently carry out any automated
decision-making.

Please note, some of these rights only apply in certain circumstances and we may not be able to fulfil every request.

11. Cookies

We want to make this website as easy to use and helpful as possible. This sometimes involves placing small amounts of information on your computer, known as 'cookies'. These cookies cannot be used to identify you personally and are only used to improve the service offered to users of this website.

Any information generated by these cookies about your use of this website will be transmitted to and stored by Google.

We will not use the statistical analytics tools to track or to collect personally identifiable information of visitors to this website. We will not associate any data gathered with any personally identifying information from any source as part of our use of the statistical analytics tools.

To comply with the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) (Amendment) Regulations 2011, we will ask for your permission to store cookies on your computer.
